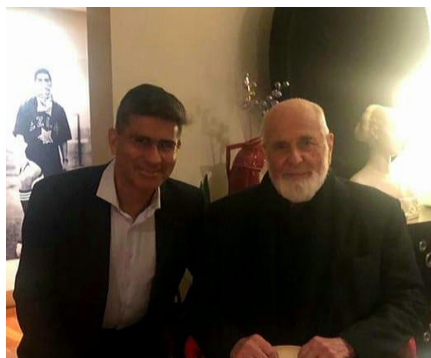

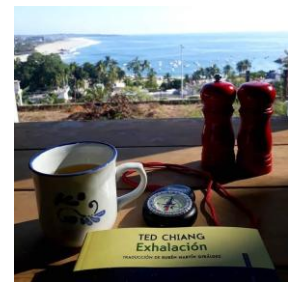
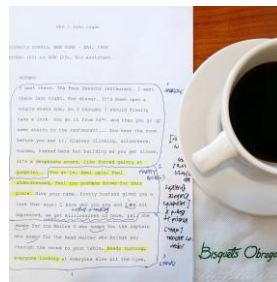
I took my first photos with an old Kodak camera. I remember those first photos fondly... but I don't miss “analogical” technology. Photos are evidence of our passage through this world; they prove our existence in the universe. My recent work is in this [gallery](#).

With [Rhapsody of the Thieving Magpie \(or May Rossini Forgive Us\)](#) I received a mention among 1,040 participants in the 25th Latin American Short Story Contest “Edmundo Valadés” (1996). My training as a writer and screenwriter continued in Milan (1999-2000) and different workshops in CDMX (2004 to date).

I am an [actor](#) and set designer; I worked for seven years in the independent theater company *A Trasluz* (1990-1997) with 17 productions and more than 700 performances. We attended three times the Muestra Nacional de Teatro in Monterrey and won awards for set design and production with *Sombra de la sombra* (1993), *El llano en llamas* (1994) and *Pueblo sin ángeles* (1996), among others. My recent acting [on-camera training](#) includes diploma courses and workshops in Mexico City: Casazul, Facultad de Cine, Peak Network and Caranarts (2023 to date).

I was a film critic for the weekly column Cinecita in the newspaper “Síntesis” (2003-2006). Since 2020 I edit audiovisual essays on cinema in Spanish, English and Italian. Among them: the resignification of the Sun Stone (“Aztec calendar”) as Easter egg in [Andor](#) —*Star Wars* prequel produced and starred by Diego Luna-; the filming and postproduction of the Argentinean series [The Eternaut](#); the referents of the Mexican feature film [Radical](#) awarded at Sundance; and the ideological implications of the Mexican film [Epitafio](#) filmed in high mountains.

I was a percussionist in the Afro-Brazilian band Batalá Mexico (2014-2020) with two fast drums: repinique and caixa. I performed in Buenos Aires, CDMX and Tepoztlán. I also play drums. During the pandemic I lived in Paradise, where I redesigned a [loft](#) (2021-2022) and projected the [Terraza Cultural](#); a meeting point for Puerto Escondido (Oaxaca, Mexico).

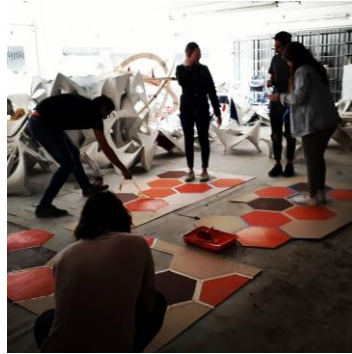

I have been a lecturer at Universidad de las Américas Puebla, Universidad Anáhuac and UNARTE (2020-2023), as well as at BUAP and other higher education institutions. This is my [Teaching Statement](#).

During 2024, as a professor of Media and Digital Culture at Tec de Monterrey, I enhanced the international impact of university short films with the [Filmmaker's Creative Toolkit](#) that I designed to provide any student with practical filmmaking techniques.

My [International Short Film Plan](#) presents six case studies led by university students who achieved global projection before the age of 25. The [Film Fest Frame](#) schedules over one hundred international film festivals in 30 countries. My seminar [Mexican Transnational Filmmakers](#) proposes an approach to the global presence of more than one hundred contemporary filmmakers from Mexico.

I designed and achieved the approval of the international course [COIL Possible Futures: Utopias and Dystopias in Cinema and Literature](#) with Florida International University: a course that promotes creative writing and digital storytelling, linked to Sustainable Development Goal 13, Climate Action. In eight years we tripled the enrollment of students in the Bachelor's Degree in Art History—to 120—and updated the program with an international vision and the consolidation of the teaching staff. We accredited the MA in Art Studies (Conacyt's PNPC) and were the first Mexican university to achieve *Substantial Equivalency Accreditation* with the National Association of Schools of Art and Design ([NASAD](#)). We created and launched the Art Editorial Board with 17 books edited and published. We organized every year the International Congress of Museums with visits to innovative and disruptive Mexican museums in Mexico City, Puebla, Oaxaca, Tlaxcala and Toluca:
